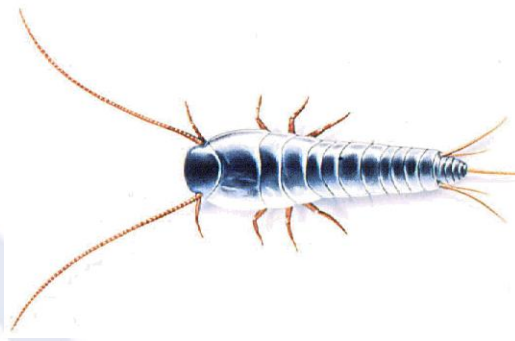


## SILVER FISH



Wing less, shady, silvery and fast prehistoric insects up to 12 mm long.

At room temperature the development of these insects can take about one year. They prefer warm and humid rooms and you often find them in bathrooms, kitchens and the likes. Silver fish are also known as "Nattsmyg" and is a relatively harmless insect.

They are shady and thrive where it is dark and damp, such as in bathrooms and kitchens underneath the panels at the bottom of kitchen cabinets, under skirting boards and other dark places.

Preferably they live of sugar and starch. In our bathrooms the diet is pretty poor.

Here they live on soap residue and grease in tile joints. Silver fish in the kitchen, however, have access to a complete set table and if the environment is damp enough they can reproduced here. It is also important of course to keep things clean. But they are usually never present in large numbers.

### What to do?

The best way to get rid of them is to use silver fish boxes / glue traps and make sure you have as dry environment as possible.

Normally there is a slightly elevated humidity under plastic mats usually in older floors. Houses built on concrete slabs are more likely to have silverfish than other building types. Another method might be lowering the humidity in houses with dehumidifiers / replace flooring.

### Instructions for silver fish trap, glue trap

Open the package and fold into the trap.

Fold the long sides at the tracked lines.

Remove the interior protective liner in the bottom of the trap.

Place one of the supplied adhesive tablets in the middle of the plate.

Fold the long sides together so as to form a "house" according to the picture below.

Place the trap for example in a kitchen cabinet or where insects are likely to reside.
